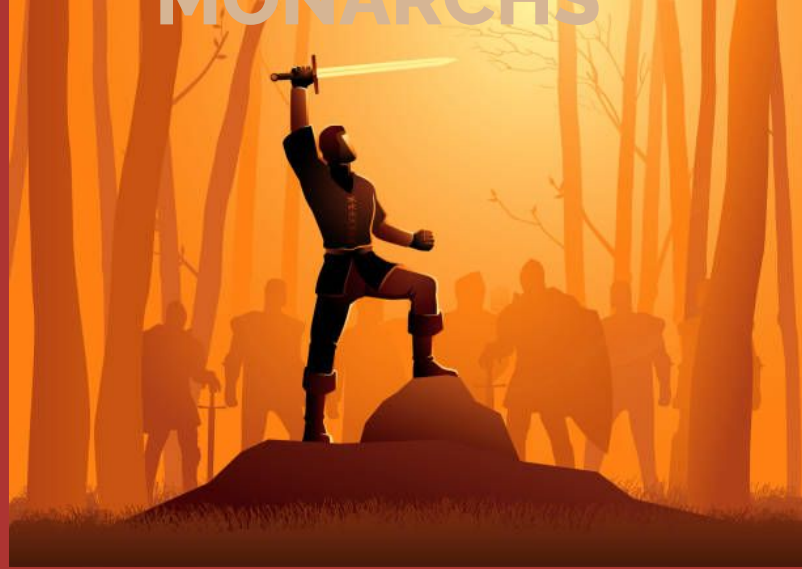

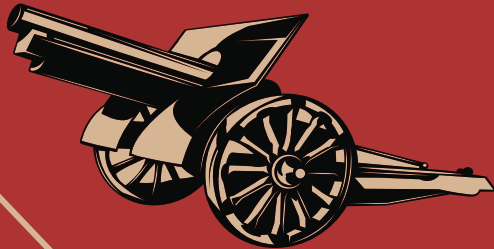

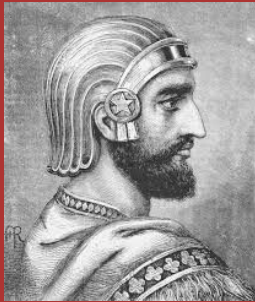

- Adult male citizens participated directly in the government of the city-state of Athens (not an all-inclusive democracy: women, slaves and foreign born men were left out)
- Eventually, democracy encompassed everyone being involved in the governance of their state (women) above the age eighteen. However...

DIFFERENCE BETWEEN COUNTRY AND NATION

- ❖ While often used interchangeably, a nation refers to a group of people united by shared culture, history, or identity, while a country is a political entity with defined borders and a government.....



- ❖ The US can be said to be the first and maybe only country, “All men are born free and equal, in dignity and in rights, and, being endowed by nature with reason and conscience, they should conduct themselves as brothers one to another”.

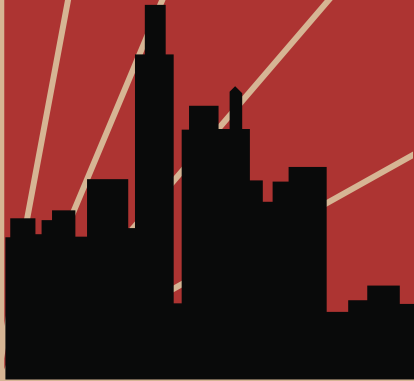
DEMAGOGUES AND THEIR RHETORIC

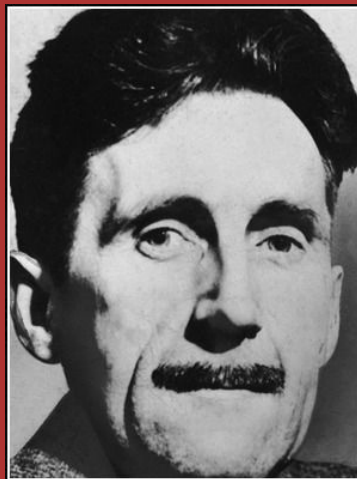
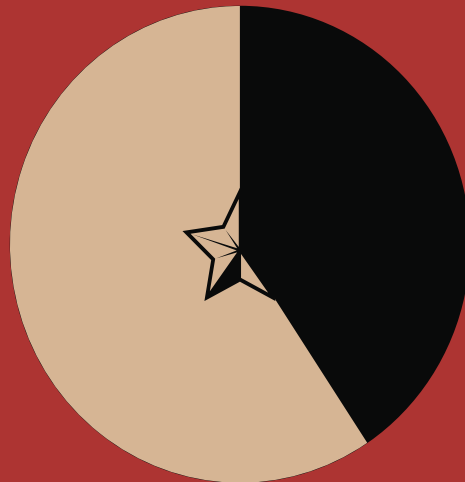
